Special thanks to Jeff Ritter and his son, Mel Watkins, Mike Brizendine, Dave Racine, John Hudson, Nick Ball and Bubba James for helping me make a huge dent in all of these ongoing projects. If you see any of these individuals please go out of your way to thank them for all they do for your club. In the next 2 to 3 weeks, members will be able to shoot from a bench rest WHILE UNDER A COVERED POINT on 9 of our ranges SIMULTANEOUSLY!

That's RIGHT...EACH of our 9 ranges on the main firing point will now have covered shooting points and this project is well underway as you read this. Until they are completely finished, PLEASE PAY ATTENTION TO THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION.

We spent numerous hours this weekend auguring holes for canopy supports around the existing bench rests on every range and until we get the posts set into cement, members need to be careful while using the bench rests to not step into one of the holes. We have taken the time to put orange painted pieces of wood into each hole to mark them for members. If you read this email and pay attention where you step you won't have any trouble navigating to the bench rests until the canopies are finished...

For those of you who didn't understand that the first time, here it is again. DON'T STEP INTO ANY HOLE THAT HAS AN ORANGE PIECE OF WOOD STICKING OUT OF IT; THAT WOULD NOT BE SAFE OR PARTICULARLY INTELLIGENT.

New Canopy Locations

- 50 Yard Pistol Range (Far West) 1 covered bench rest)
- 100 Meter Range (1 covered bench rest)
- 250 Yard Main Rifle Range (2 covered bench rests West side)
- 250 Yard Main Rifle Range (2 covered bench rests East side)
- NEW 66 yard Pistol Range (2 covered bench rests)
- NEW 500 yard Rifle Range (2 covered bench rests)
- 800 yard Rifle Range (Far East range, 4 covered bench rests, 2 West & 2 East)

PLEASE DO NOT MOVE or Tamper with any of the bench rests or holes, the benches are all where they need to be as are the holes. We have also augured holes on several ranges for new target stands, STAY AWAY from them too please...

New Electronic Gate and Electricity for Club

We are also working on bringing in power to our new building and to our property; John Hudson is spear heading this as our resident Master Electrician. The last guy we were using got electrocuted lol.... We are working towards putting in another electronic gate by our new building and Buddy Moore and Mel Watkins are helping make this happen this spring.

Jeff Ritter, Dave Racine and our very helpful 4H members are working on the new parking area and it looks like their first night shooting on our range is likely going to be Tuesday April 11th. Members are reminded that from April 11th, until Labor day in September, our 4H members will be using the far west pistol range and the 100 meter range right next to it, from 5 pm until dark on every Tuesday night, and BOTH OF THESE RANGES WILL BE CLOSED TO RGGC MEMBER SHOOTING during these time periods.

ONCE again, when entering the RGGC to shoot on these nights during these times, if the gate is open and an attendant is present, you will need to HOLD UP YOUR 4H BADGE OR YOUR RGGC GATE CARD FOR ATTENDANT...THIS IS NON-NEGOTIABLE SO JUST DO IT!
